Provided Landscaping Services*

- Mow and edge Bermuda grass
- Fertilize Bermuda grass
- Aerate turf in the spring
- Pre-emergent fertilizer and lime in the fall
- Mulch plant beds
- Prune shrubs, excluding roses
- Spray for Bermuda grass encroachment into mulch beds
- Blow and remove leaves
- Prune trees December of each year – 10 feet up
- Spray dormant oil on deciduous trees and shrubs
- Mulch street trees
- Weed control

Residents' landscape responsibilities

- Water lawn, as needed (excluding villas)
- Treat lawn disease and/or insect problems
- Water mulch bed plantings, as needed (excluding villa plantings served by drip lines)
- Fertilize mulch bed plantings
- Treat disease and/or insect problems in mulch bed plantings
- Water trees, as needed
- Fertilize trees
- Treat tree disease and/or insect problems
- Remove and replace untreatable diseased and/or dying shrubs and trees
- Remove and replace untreatable diseased and/or dying Bermuda grass

***Additional services can be contracted by request at a cost to the homeowner.**

Also, once a year in December residents may opt-out of certain services. However, there is no reduction in monthly dues.
