Congress passed the REAL ID Act requiring states to issue identification that meets higher security standards. It meets federal identification requirements for TSA and federal facilities, allowing you to board flights or enter federal facilities without additional documentation. REAL ID costs the same s a driver license and identification card. N.C. REAL IDs are only available by visiting a driver license office, where an individual's required documents will be scanned and permanently stored, as required under federal law, in the individual's NCDMV record.
