## **Community Pools & Amberly**

## Carolina Preserve's indoor and outdoor pools are open:

6AM-10PM – Monday through Saturday 10AM-8PM – Sunday (Oct 1 – Apr 31 the indoor pool closes at 6PM on Sundays)


Children under 19 years old are <u>NOT</u> permitted to use the outdoor pool. Children's INDOOR pool hours (with adult supervision):

11AM-1PM — Monday-Saturday 1PM-3PM — Sunday

Check the indoor pool's updated schedule for the most current information.

Carolina Preserve is one of several communities that comprise the Amberly Master Association.

Approximately \$37 of your monthly dues goes to Amberly. This entitles you to use all "Amberly Residence Club" facilities at no additional charge. Facilities include basketball and pickleball courts, fitness classes, and outdoor swimming pools.



There's even a pool with waterslides for children. And yes, you CAN take your grandchildren and guests to enjoy it (*please refer to Amberly Guest Pass Policy on pg.11b*) For current guest limitations, call Amberly at (919) 461-2352.

Carolina Preserve residents can use the Amberly facilities but other Amberly (non-CP) residents CANNOT use CP facilities.

Get your Amberly pass.

Pay a one- time \$10 fee per person at the Residence Club. Take your HUD/closing statements for your new I.D., or a statement showing proof of your current CP address for your free annual renewal.



## **Amberly Guest Pass Policy**

- Each household is allotted thirty (30) free guest passes per year. The annual allotment does not override daily guest policy allowances (currently at 4).
- One (1) guest pass is deducted upon check-in to the facility for each guest above the age of two (2) who accompanies a member.
- Once the thirty (30) passes are exhausted for the household, a member may choose to pay the Guest Pass fee per guest, per visit, for the duration of the calendar year. The fee is currently \$5 per additional Guest Pass (subject to change).
- No guests at all are allowed on the dates of major holidays: Memorial Day, 4<sup>th</sup> of July and Labor Day
